

FRIENDS' OF THE TERREBONNE PUBLIC LIBRARY **SCHOLARSHIP**

- The scholarship is open to all individuals who either reside or work in Terrebonne Parish. Applicant must be pursuing a master's degree or certification in the library and information science field.
- The applicant must:
 - a) Maintain status as a full-time or part-time student as defined in the college catalog.
 - b) Maintain a 3.0 grade point average.
 - c) Supply two letters of recommendation, one of which should be from a professional in the library field.
 - d) Provide a brief essay on your career and personal goals.
- The applicant may be scheduled for an interview to discuss his/her application with a panel of judges.
- The \$600 per year scholarship for part-time students and \$1200 per year scholarship for full-time students is paid in two equal payments, one per semester.
- A scholarship recipient may reapply from year to year.
- All applications must be received no later than December 1 of the current year.
- The official presentation of the scholarship may be made at an event sponsored by the Friends of the Terrebonne Public Library no later than February 15 of the current year.
