### What can I do with a library card?

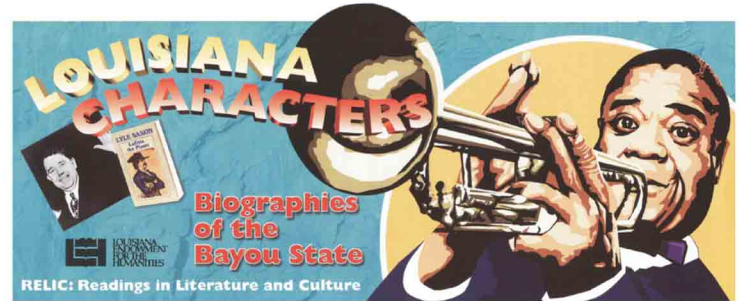
