

VOLUNTEER INCOME TAX ASSISTANCE

**TUESDAYS IN FEBRUARY
9 AM – 12 PM @ MAIN LIBRARY**

The **Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA)** group, in partnership with **Catholic Charities**, is returning this year to provide free tax preparation assistance for individuals and families who need help filing their taxes. This valuable service is designed to ensure that everyone can file their taxes accurately and on time—without the burden of expensive tax preparation fees.

Appointments & Process:

Appointments for tax assistance will continue to be offered on a first-come, first-served basis. Patrons should plan ahead and arrive early to secure their spot.

Steps to Complete Your Tax Filing:

- **Gather Your Documents** – Bring all necessary tax documentation, including W-2s, 1099s, Social Security statements, identification, and any other relevant paperwork.
- **Drop Off Your Documents** – Visit the Main Library on a Tuesday between **9:00 AM and 12:00 PM** to submit your tax documents.
- **Pick Up Your Filed Documents** – You will receive a phone call when your tax filing is complete. Pick-up times will be available between **3:00 PM and 4:30 PM** on the same day.

This service will be available on the second floor of the **Main Library** every Tuesday in February (excluding Tuesday, February 17th) through April 14.


