Terrebonne Parish Library System recognized as Finalist for 2018 National Medal for Museum and Library Service

The Institute of Museum and Library Services has recognized Terrebonne Parish Library System as one of 29 finalists for the 2018 National Medal for Museum and Library Service.



Programs such as the Jambalaya Writers' Conference (bottom left image), Terrebonne Comic Con (bottom right image), and Terrebonne Games Expo have become staples in the community. Terrebonne Parish Library System provides significant contributions across all nine branches and continues to serve with innovative programs that bridge generational and socioeconomic gaps. Each branch offers programs that target specific demographics in their area, such as East Houma's Cinco de Mayo celebration, Dularge's crafts and guilters clubs, and Dulac's ongoing community history project.



The National Medal is the highest honor a museum or library can receive.

"To be nominated as one of the top 15 libraries in the country for the National Medal, the highest honor a library can receive, is a tribute to the library staff, board members, and community. As a public library it is important that we listen to the community needs, and being nominated for the National Medal shows that we hear our citizens," said library director Mary Cosper-LeBoeuf.

In 2017, the library was awarded the American Dream Literacy Grant through the American Library Association, which made 'Conectando,' a program targeted towards adult language learners, possible. Terrebonne Parish Library, in partnership with the Second Harvest Food Bank, has also provided a summer snack program to feed children in the rural areas of Dulac, Gibson, and East Houma.

"Terrebonne Parish Library is the community center, and being recognized for the fifth time for this honor is a testament that a library is important to its community," said Cosper-LeBoeuf. "A big thank you to the Institute of Museum and Library Services for nominating the Terrebonne Parish Library for the National Medal."

You are stranded on a desert island and can only bring one book with you. What do you choose and why?



Terrebonne Parish Library System has partnered with several schools in the area to organize this year's inaugural Battle of the Books competition.

This program is sponsored by the Friends of the Terrebonne Public Library and is the first of its kind hosted by a library in the state of Louisiana.



Participating schools include Houma Christian School, St. Matthews Episcopal School, Maria Immacolata Catholic School (seen here during practice), and St. Francis de Sales Cathedral School. Books include *Number the Stars* by Lois Lowry, *A Wrinkle in Time* by Madeline L'Engle, *Hatchet* by Gary Paulsen, and several others.



Students at each school have been grouped into teams to compete with each other in a school-wide battle. The battles are structured as a Family Feud-style competition.

1st place, 2nd place, and 3rd place winners will be announced. Those who place 1st and 2nd at each school will move on to compete against each other in an area battle where winners will be judged not just on trivia challenges but also on best team costume, sportsmanship, and school spirit.

The public is invited to attend the area battle, which will be hosted Saturday, April 28 from 9:30 AM – 12:30 PM at the North Branch Library.
