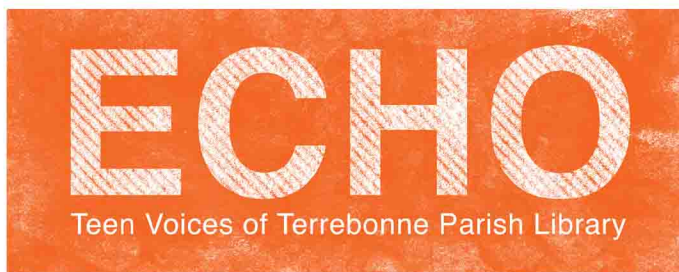
### FRIENDS Inventory Reduction BOOK SALE — AUGUST 20 & 21 —

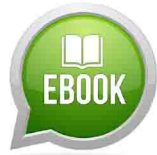

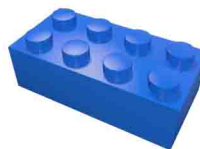

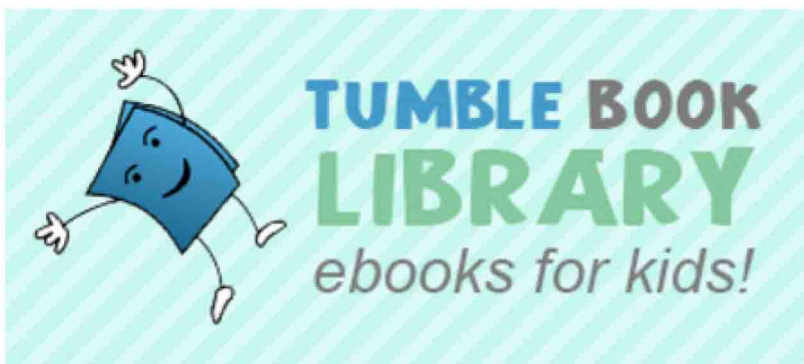

### Axis 360 (ebook service)

Access a variety of ebook titles through Baker & Taylor's innovative Axis 360 Digital Media Library. Enjoy the dynamic presentation of titles on the magic wall, the ease of locating books of interest, as well as guidance provided via book reviews and recommendations for further reading. All you need is your library card to get started.

### Flipster (magazine service)

Dive in and flip through! Instant access to the most popular magazines. With Flipster, it's simple to select your favorite digital magazines from the Flipster newsstand and start reading.

### Overdrive (e-Library)

You can browse our collection, check out with your library card, and download to PC, Mac, and many mobile devices. Titles can be enjoyed immediately or transferred to a variety of devices, including iPod, Sony Reader, and many others. Some audio titles can also be burned to a CD to listen on-the-go. Titles will automatically expire at the end of the lending period. There are no late fees!

Freegal is a music service that allows free and legal downloads of music you get to keep! Yes, free and yours forever. While Freegal also has an app available for iPhone and Android devices, we would suggest that songs are downloaded directly to your computer. 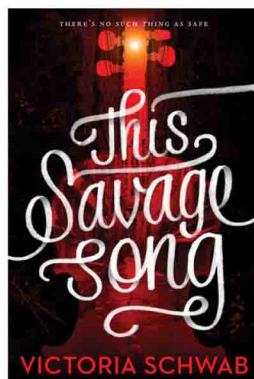

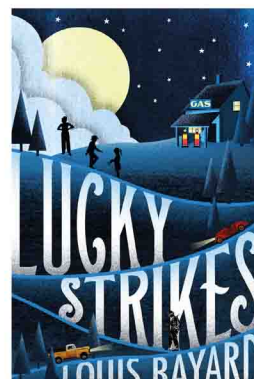
