"We need to haunt the house of history and listen anew to the ancestors' wisdom." – Maya Angelou Ancestry.com is an online genealogy database comprised of over 1.2 billion records in over 3000 databases. It is one of the largest and best organized online resources for genealogy.

Accessing Ancestry.com is easy and free from inside the library. Simply type the library's URL (mytpl.org) into your browser to get started. Unfortunately, you will have to pay for the subscription if you are accessing the database from outside the library.



DATABASES

At all Terrebonne Parish Library branches, researchers have full access to the following materials:

- Ancestry Library Edition (in-library access only) access to millions of records from around the globe, with new records added
 daily.
- Fold3 Hi F
- HeritageOuest Online Digital, searchable images of Revolutionary War Records. U.S. federal census records. Freedman's Bank

If you're inside the library and on the library's webpage, you will see at the very top of the screen on the right-hand side the menu headline "Genealogy." This will lead you to a list of resources. Under the menu titled "Databases," you will find the Ancestry Library Edition.

Once on the website, you will find that the menu is divided into 6 tabs: Home, Search, Message Boards, Learning Center, Charts & Forms, and New Collections. Under each tab is additional information with indexes to other databases that can be further explored.

Terrebonne Parish Library Genealogy is located on the second floor of the Main library. If you are just beginning to piece together your family tree, or if you have a research question with which you would like some help, the library staff offers one-on-one consultations and training.
